#### The 9 voting systems available consist of 2 different types of systems offered by 5 different vendors.

This chart navigates the decision process by considering the most important criteria first, eliminates those systems that don't meet them and goes on to the secondary considerations until we see which vendor offers a system with all the best features.

# Dominion, ES&S, Unisyn have accessible BMDs that use

non-human readable barcodes on the ballots. Not verifiable so accuracy can't be assured.



#### Clear Ballot & Hart

ALL ballots (hand-marked and accessible) are same paper, shape and size for anonymity for all voters.



#### Clear Ballot, Hart

All VHM systems cost less and are easier to use vs. BMDs systems. Can upsize easily for busy elections so fewer lines.

Hart uses outdated Windows 7



**Clear Ballot** uses

Windows 10, commercial-offthe-shelf equipment/supplies for easier upgrading, has outstanding audit software

#### **BMDs-for-all**

Dominion, ES&S, Hart, Unisyn use BARCODES for scanner to interpret, not verifiable so accuracy can't be assured. Experts say BMDs being used by all voters introduces unnecessary security vulnerabilities. Studies show most voters don't or can't verify accuracy of ballots prior to scanning.

These systems are not accessible for all voters.



#### **All BMDs systems**

are out of contention for failing these top criteria, but also fall short compared to hand-marked systems for secondary considerations, too.

Need more machines, are more expensive to purchase, maintain, transport. Lines can form in busy elections with fewer spaces to vote, if voters have difficulty using, or if they malfunction.
